



## **Summer School 2019** **Program and Policies**

### **Morning Academics**

The academic morning at Sierra provides enrichment and reinforcement. Small class size and individualized programs ensure success. Good study habits and organizational skills are emphasized. Teachers enjoy a close working relationship with their students throughout the summer. The reading and language arts program focuses on reading comprehension, writing and spelling skills. Students are offered an intensive remedial program or an enrichment program which emphasizes knowledge of literature and development of creative writing skills. Our math program is designed to strengthen basic skills, pace and accuracy. Critical thinking and problem solving techniques are stressed at all grade levels.

### **Lunch**

Students attending our full day program should bring a lunch. Lunch is from 12:00 p.m. until 1:00 p.m. "Morning only" students may stay for lunch if they choose to do so. For students who are signed up for "Afternoons only," the program does not start until 1:00 p.m. and those students should not be on campus prior to 1:00 p.m.

### **Afternoon Recreation**

Our recreation program begins at 1pm. The afternoons at Sierra Summer are jam packed with exciting activities that surround a weekly theme. Arts and crafts, games, hands on learning, exploring, scavenger hunts, adventures, relay races and water play are just a sneak peek into our fun filled summer! The afternoon program is designed to incorporate these themed activities until 4:30pm. At 4:30pm students will transition into a "free play" environment where board games, reading, drawing, movies, outside play, music, and creative activities are incorporated. The afternoon program ends promptly at 6pm.
